If you answered yes to any of the above questions, the Women In New Roles Program may be for you.

About Women In New Roles

The Women In New Roles Program was started in 1978 when so many women began returning to school. Special needs prompted the design for the program, which offers Psychology of Adjustment/Human Relations and Applied Psychology (career/work focus) in a blended and integrated curriculum.

Women experience a blocked 6-hour college credit program with day and night classes available. Following a semester in this program, the women branch into specialty areas with more confidence and direction.

The semester is spent in activity and study specifically geared for the woman who needs to re-establish her confidence and her skills and determine in which direction her career will move. Some students take the program for a change of career, while others are entering the work world for the first time.

In addition to the class time spent together, the women have the option of networking together through the Women In New Roles Network, Women's Symposium, and Young Women's Leadership Track. At the beginning of each month, a presenter gives a program of special interest to the community.

Instructors in the program are psychology instructors and/or professional counselors. Individual attention is given to each woman as she works through her career search.

Highlights of Women In New Roles

- ✓ A unique college credit program designed to assist women in the transition of returning to school.
- ✓ No entrance requirements to the Women In New Roles Program, but you must meet TCC admission requirements for credit registration.
- ✓ Association with other women who have similar needs and interests.
- ✓ Studies in self-awareness, communication skills, both intra- and interpersonal relations for confidence building, and leadership skill development.
- ✓ Testing, counseling, career placement, Internet orientation, networking, and group mentoring.
- ✓ Guided practice in interviewing and résumé writing.

Scholarship Programs

The Women's Policy Forum Scholarship

This scholarship was established in honor of TCC's chancellor to benefit the WINR Program.

Paulos Family Endowed Scholarship Dr. Laura Smith Scholarship

These scholarships are designed for students wanting to improve the quality of life for themselves and their families through obtaining an Associate Degree or Certificate of Completion at TCC. Preference is given to Women In New Roles students.

Boyd and Quimby Scholarship

This scholarship was established for TCC students who face the challenges of single parenting and/or returning to school, wishing to improve the quality of life for themselves and/or their families.

Frances Schuessler Scholarship

The Frances Schuessler Scholarship Fund was developed for Women In New Roles students who are pursuing a degree with an emphasis in the humanities or fine arts.

Liliane Bailey Scholarship

The Liliane Bailey Women In New Roles Scholarship Fund was established in 1994 following the death of Liliane Bailey, a former Women In New Roles student who went on to earn her degree and establish her career.

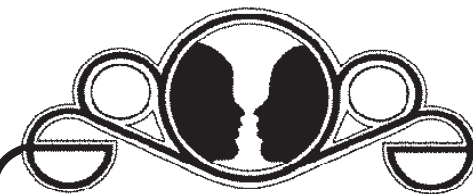
